Great! Now what do I do to get the software? Where do I go?

1. Software is only available to students with an Architecture computing account. If you have a valid account, go to Wurster 477 and request the desired software. In exchange for a valid student ID, we'll give you up to 2 discs at a time.
2. You must have internet connection for your computer. For most people in Wurster Hall, this means the wireless network, CEDPROXIM. Wireless access comes with your Architecture computing account. Once your computer's wireless Mac address has been added to the CED servers, your wireless access will be enabled. Information on how to do this can be found on the Wireless FAQ (found at our *Documents* site—www.ced.berkeley.edu/trouble, or outside the door of 477 Wurster).
3. In order for any of the applications to work, you must install Sassafras Keyserver FIRST. This should be the first disc you check out. If you already have Sassafras installed, ensure that you have a valid license by going to the Start menu and opening KeyVerify.
4. All instructions on how to install the software can be found online @ www.ced.berkeley.edu/trouble. Click the "Docs" link near the top of the page and look for the relevant installation documents. Note: there are a lot of other helpful documents and resources available at this webpage.

Where can I use the software? Do I have to be in the building?

You can use the software *anywhere* as long as you are connected to the internet and can communicate with our servers. For most people, this generally means they need to be connected to CEDPROXIM while they are in Wurster Hall. But you could also use software at Starbucks, AirBears, at home, etc.
